*From the Vicarage, January 2016*

*Dear Friends,*

It is good sometimes to be able to make a fresh start, to put the past behind us and look to a better future. New Year provides such an opportunity and many people use this occasion to resolve to do better than in the past. The Romans had a god, Janus (hence January), who was especially remembered at New Year. He had two faces, one looking backward to the year that was ending and one facing the future. We are more familiar with the New Year symbol of an old man carrying a scythe, representing the 'dying year', and a very young figure holding an hour glass with great hopes for the new life ahead.

Fires play a significant part in New Year festivals. This is a custom dating back to pre-Christian times. Indians in North America symbolically extinguished their old fires and scattered the ashes before lighting 'new' ones and seeking the blessing of their gods. The 'Clean Sweep' theme is practiced in Japan where there is a 'Beginning of Things' festival where homes are thoroughly cleaned and even decorated. At Allendale, Northumberland, barrels of burning tar are carried in procession to light a fire at Midnight on New Year's Eve. Yet other cultures use other calendars.

The Indian calendar has its starting point as October; ancient Iran didn't have a calendar, as such, and events were simply recorded in the reign of a particular king. Many of these festivals involve music and dance and, generally, having a good time. Scotland is a little later with Hogmanay and even later still with Burn's Night and Haggis, but it is all about coming together and celebrating with one another. This year began to draw to a close with our Carol Service and it was a wonderful event that contained all the ingredients that the idea of 'New Beginning' should encompass :- community coming together, laughter, children

gazing at the beautifully decorated tree, the same children bringing the different figures forward to place in the crib. Thanks are due to ALL the people who contribute so selflessly to decorating, cleaning, staffing, and supporting the various services. Jill and I would like to thank you all for the considerable support we have received personally from so many during the year. There have been many highs, and there have been some lows, but at no time did we ever feel less than totally supported and encouraged. Maurice
