*From the Vicarage, February 2018*

*Dear Friends,*

February to me is the time when we can begin to put winter behind us and look forward to the new growth and life of spring. Our gardens begin to fill with flowers and the fields with green shoots and baby animals. Life means all sorts of things to different people. What ‘floats your boat’, ‘gets you going’ ‘energises you’ are some of the expressions we use to describe the things which really interest and animate us and give us life. I wonder if any of you have been asked what your ‘prayer life’ might mean to you and to others.

The Diocese of Chichester recently launched its diocesan initiative for 2018 to encourage and develop our personal and public prayer lives. I am often asked; ‘say a prayer for me vicar’ and I am always happy to do so. Prayer though is not the prerogative of the clergy! Prayer does not always mean the formality of a church service or need to be ‘done’ by the vicar– much though it is always good to be together to pray! As we look forward this year to the coming of spring and all the indications of new life which we see around us, I encourage you to reflect on the practice of praying. Prayer can invigorate, comfort, inspire or console. It can happen anywhere and everywhere. It can be structured or totally informal. It offers a different sort of new life – that of reaching into the inner depths of our souls so we better understand ourselves and one another. In other words, it can touch our hearts in the most unexpected of ways and bring vision and energy into our lives.

At St Mary’s we will be using a Lent course called Inspiring Vision. It is a series of 6 standalone talks, presented as podcasts. It considers how the visual arts provide inspiration and pathways to prayer. Come and join me and others and try one for yourself! They begin at The Vicarage on Monday 26<sup>th</sup> February at 2.30. Come for a chat and a cuppa! And if you want to try a bit

of praying, just stand quietly wherever you might be and thank God for something good which has happened to you or in the world today. That's praying! Or drop in to St Mary's sometime during the week. If you simply stand and reflect in the peace and beauty of the church you will have already 'said a prayer'.

As winter turns to spring, I pray that your lives will be energised through the power of prayer and that your hopes and dreams will be fulfilled. And if religion doesn't 'float your boat' just saying thank you for each new day can't be a bad way to begin - can it? I believe that's praying too!
