*From the Vicarage, July 2014*

*Dear Friends,*

July is a wonderful mass of ‘Summery’ things, in terms of festivals, as well as being the month when St Swithun’s Day occurs. Bishop of Winchester in the 9<sup>th</sup> century, Swithun is, probably, best known for the childrens’ rhyme:-

‘St Swithun’s Day if thou dost rain  
For forty days it will remain,  
St Swithun’s Day if thou be fair,  
For forty days will rain name mar’

Across the world the importance of the sun was the focus of festivals and celebrations. Native Americans (called Red Indians when I was a boy!!) held many complicated religious rituals at this time, but some practices were common to all the tribes. One, in particular, was the Dance Facing the Sun. This ‘dance’ usually lasted 4 days – performed in a circle, facing a tree and not eating and drinking for the 4 days. Some would pierce their bodies with skewers and attach them to the central pole/tree with cords, and they would dance until their flesh broke. This was believed/thought to bring the dancer, and through the dance the tribe, closer to the Great Spirit. The Great Spirit would, no doubt they thought, reward them with buffalo, which they could hunt, as well as ensure good harvests. Such was the abundance of yield from these harvests, often occurring twice because of the climate of North America at that time that the expression ‘Indian Summer’ came into the lectionary. There are, of course, variations of such dances. The Cherokees held a Green Corn Dance, but they danced in a double circle round a drummer in front of a temple structure.

These were examples of the many ways that people of the past found to make a thank offering to God. An Arapaho Sun Prayer goes as follows.....

‘We cannot cease praying to You, my Father, Man-Above, for we desire to

live on this earth...May our thought reach to the sky where there is holiness.

Give us water and an abundance of food.'

But please hold off the water on the 15<sup>th</sup> !!..... (I made the last line up!!).
